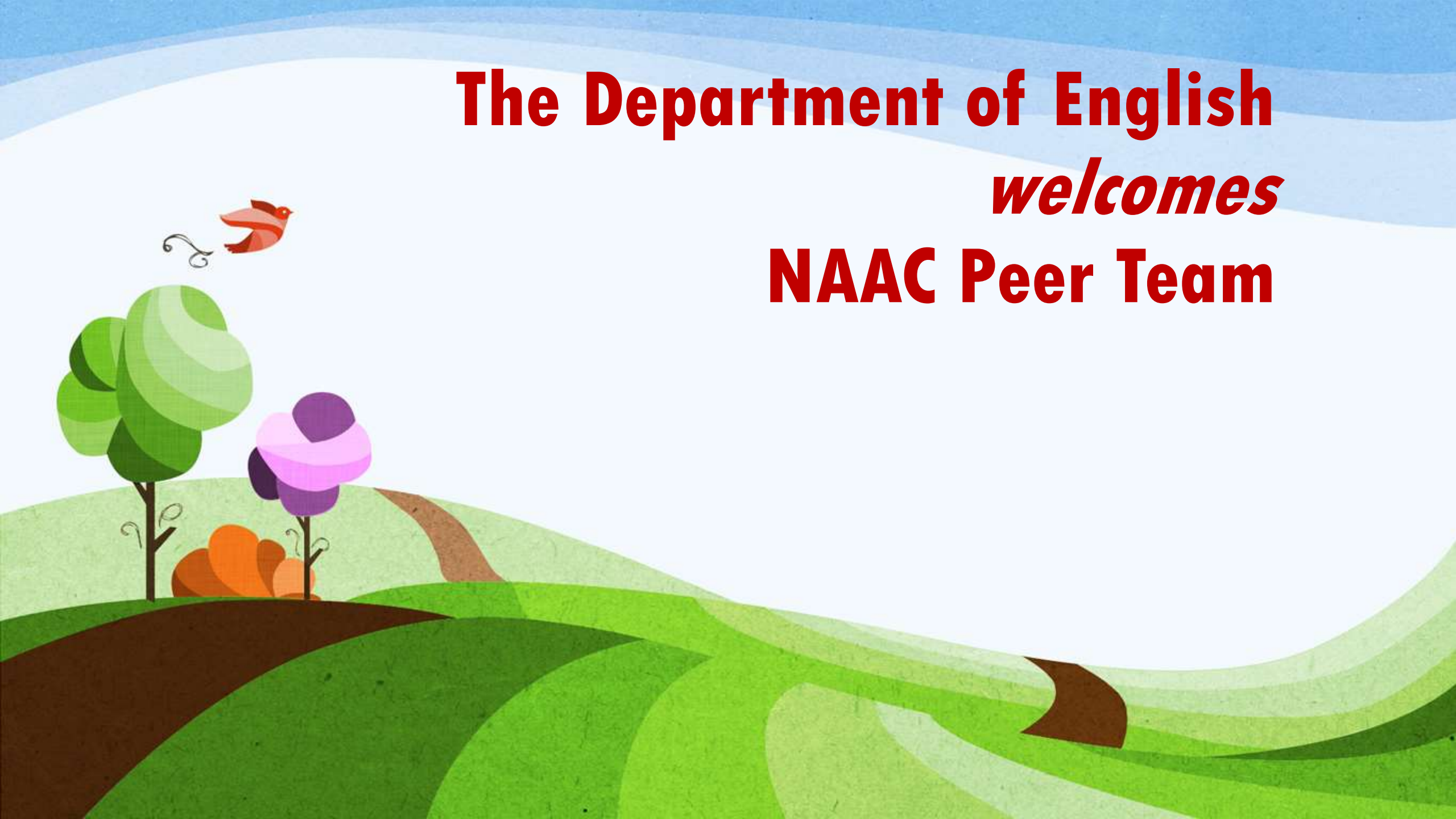

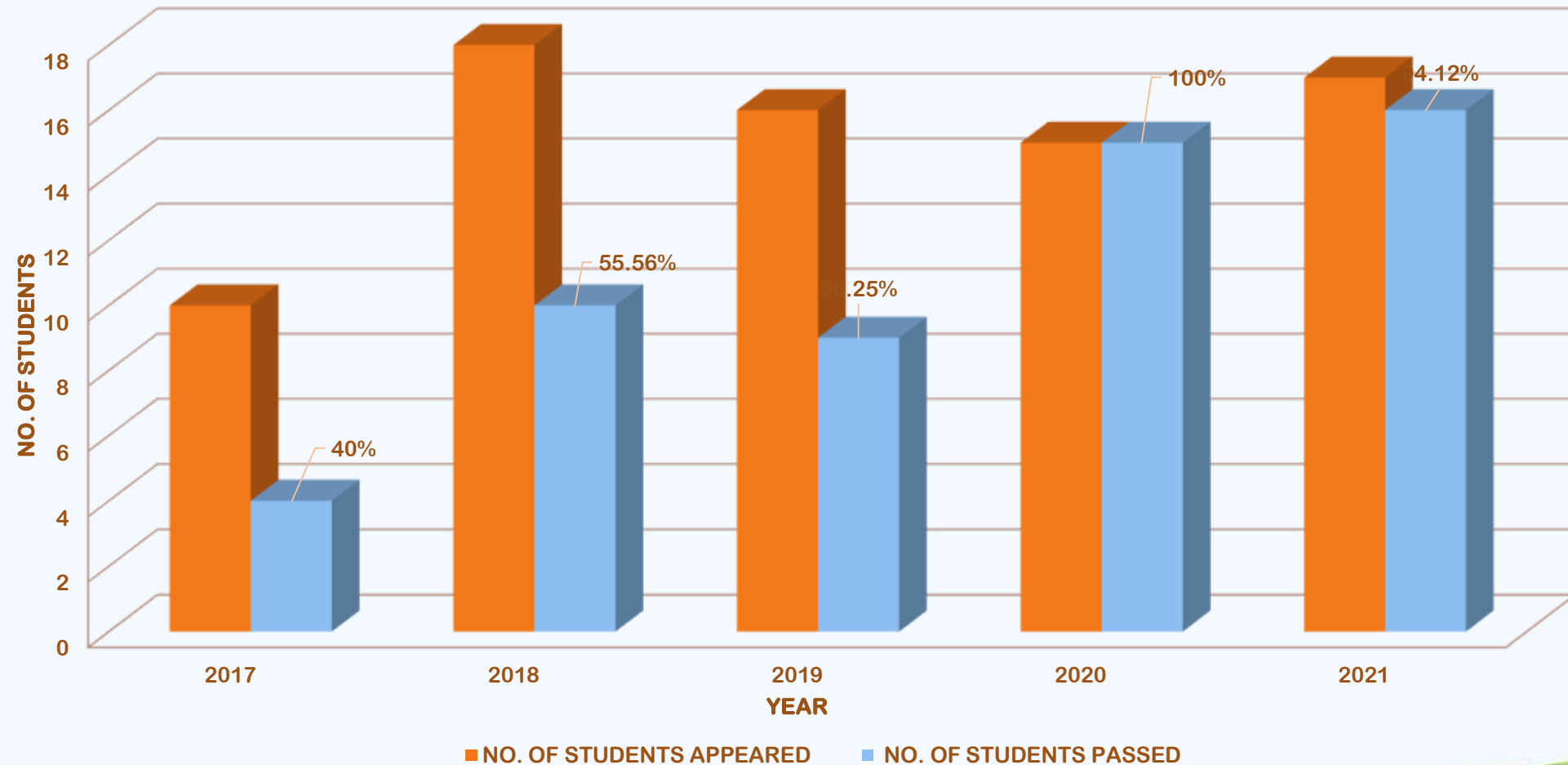

At its instructions, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has framed a course to teach diversity and peace to students on the concept of 'global citizenship'.

The UGC has directed all higher education institutions to adopt the Global Citizenship Education (GCE) framework devised by the regulator. The letter, accessed by ThePrint, also highlights that the course will dwell on topics like human rights, gender equality, peace, and sustainable development.

The National Education Policy 2020 that makes a strong pitch for it. The UGC wants all higher education institutions to be aware of and understand global issues and to become active promoters of inclusive, secure and sustainable societies.

The concept of 'global citizenship' in the National Education Policy 2020 is to create a global citizen, not only in thought, knowledge, skills, values, and rights, sustainable development and global citizen. It also mentions the concept of Global Citizenship Education (GCED) provided to empower learners to become active promoters of societies. GCED framework is available at <https://www.ugc.ac.in/ebook.asp>

The UGC has directed all higher education institutions to adopt the GCED framework and integrate the concept of 'global citizenship' in their curriculum. It added,

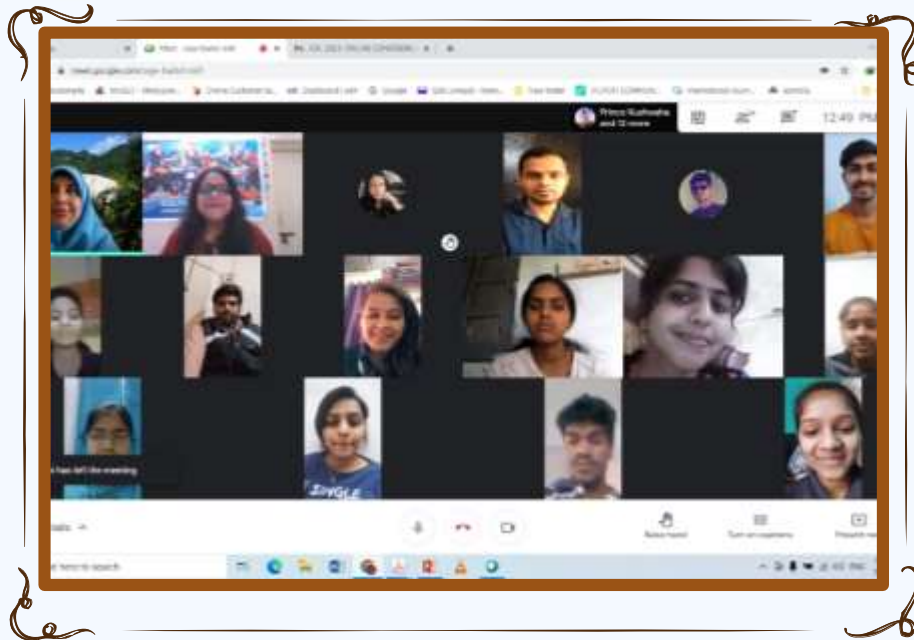
"The course should include 'global governance systems, structures and issues', which will help students to explore the interconnectedness between local and global issues and explore the interconnectedness between local and global issues."

The UGC also mentioned that "Respecting differences in culture and tolerance", the curriculum says: "Respecting differences in culture and tolerance with respect for diversity is the core essence of global citizenship".

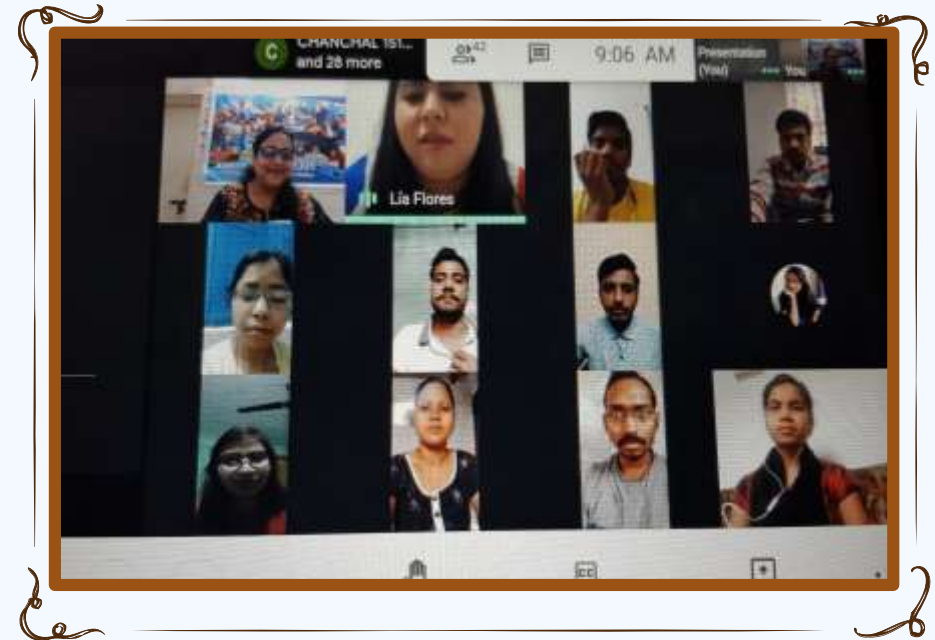
Pedagogical Principals

उच्च शिक्षा में ऑनलाइन कक्षाओं का समायोजन स्वीकारना होगा : डॉ. पाल्टा

दुर्ग, 7 जून (देशबन्धु)। उच्च शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में कोविड-19 वें के कारण परंपरागत कक्षा आयोजित न हो पाने के कारण ऑनलाइन क्लासेस, वर्चुअल क्लासरूप का प्रयोग हो रहा है। हम सभी को उच्च शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में हो रहे परिवर्तन को स्वीकारना होगा। ये उद्गार हेमचंद्र यादव विश्वविद्यालय, दुर्ग के अंग्रेजी विभाग द्वारा आयोजित दो दिवसीय इंटीनेशनल वेबीनार का उद्घाटन करते हुए प्रतिभागियों को संबोधित कर रही थीं। डॉ. पाल्टा ने कहा कि वर्चुअल क्लासेस परंपरागत कक्षाओं का पूरक हो सकती हैं परन्तु पूर्ण सबसे उनका स्थान नहीं ले सकती। डॉ. पाल्टा के अनुसार वर्चुअल क्लासेस के अनेक फायदे भी हैं जिन्हें स्वीकारते हुए हमें परिवर्तन के रचनात्मक रूप से स्वीकारना होगा।

इससे पूर्व वेबीनार की आयोजक डॉ. सोमाली गुप्ता ने आरंभ में वेबीनार के विषय "इमर्जिंग चैलेंज इन टीचिंग लिटरेचर एंड लैंग्वेज इन द वर्चुअल वर्ल्ड" की प्रासंगिता पर प्रकाश डाला। डॉ. सोमाली ने कहा कि ऑनलाइन शिक्षण पद्धति हमारे भारत में शिक्षकों एवं विद्यार्थियों दोनों के लिये नई है। अतः दोनों तरफसे प्रयास किये जाने की आवश्यकता है। अंग्रेजी विभाग

की विभागाध्यक्ष डॉ. मीता चक्रवर्ती ने स्वागत भाषण दिया। प्राचार्य डॉ. आर. एन. सिंह की अस्वस्थता के कारण वे भौतिक रूप से वेबीनार में शामिल नहीं हो सके। उनका शुभकामना संदेश अंग्रेजी की प्राध्यापक डॉ. सुचित्रा गुप्ता ने पढ़ा।

साइंस कालेज में अंग्रेजी का इंटरनेशनल वेबीनार आरंभ

लगभग 10 देशों के 300 प्रतिभागियों ने इस इंटरनेशनल वेबीनार में हिस्सा लिया। प्रथम दिवस में रूस, अमेरिका, जार्जिया, सर्बिया, यूके, कनाडा, यूएई, तेहरान, जर्मनी, फ्रांस आदि देशों के प्रतिभागियों के साथ-साथ भारत के 20 प्रदेशों के प्राध्यापक एवं शोधकर्ता शामिल थे।

वेबीनार के प्रथम स्रोत वक्ता के रूप में सर्बिया की यूनिवर्सिटी ऑफ निस की एसोसिएट प्रोफेसर डॉ. नाडेजा स्टोजकोविक ने "ऑनलाइन टीचिंग इन स्पेसिफिक परपज" विषय पर रोचक व्याख्यान दिया। डॉ. नाडेजा ने कहा कि अनेकता में एकता वाला भारत ऑनलाइन शिक्षण के माध्यम से भी विश्व में शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में विशिष्ट स्थान प्राप्त

कर सकता है। उन्होंने कहा कि कैनब्रिज वि.वि. में सत्र 2021 में पूरी पढ़ाई ऑनलाइन होगी। वेबीनार के दौरान पैनल डिस्कशन में प्रोफेसर मनीष श्रीवास्तव, डॉ. दीपविता श्रीवास्तव डॉ. सविता सिंह, डॉ. मीनू भाटिया कपूर शामिल थीं। पैनल परिचर्चा का संचालन ल साइंस कॉलेज दुर्ग की डॉ. मर्सी जार्ज ने किया।

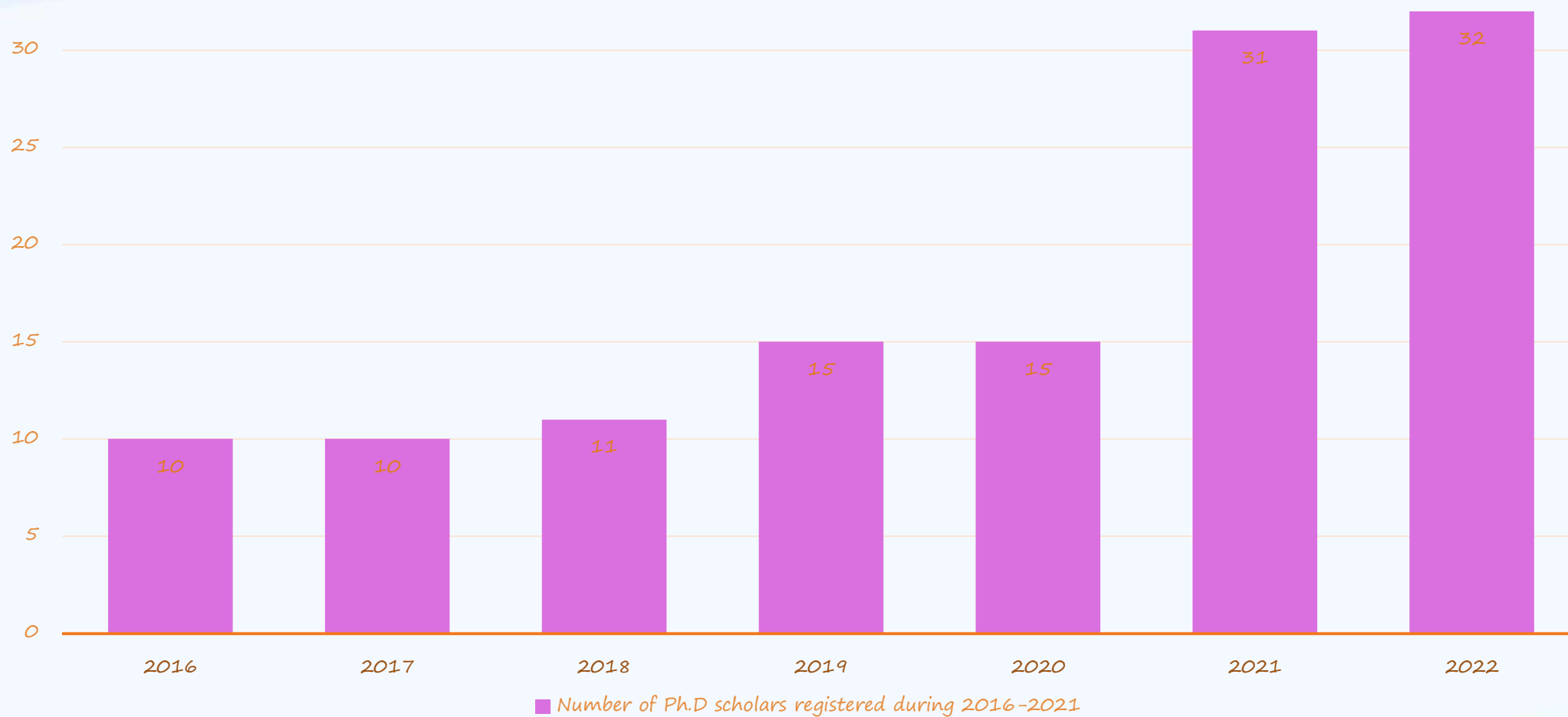
